

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE REGULAR WYOMING CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
HELD AT CITY HALL, JUNE 7, 2021 AT 7:00 P.M.**

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Jack Poll.

The Invocation was given by Pastor Mike Young, Newhall Christian Fellowship Church.

Present: Councilmembers Bolt, DeKryger, Fitzgerald, Postema, Postler, Mayor Poll.

Councilmember Postema moved, seconded by Councilmember Postler, to excuse Councilmember Vanderwood from the meeting.

Motion carried: 6 Yeas 0 Nays

The minutes of the May 17, 2021 Regular Meeting were approved by unanimous consent.

A resolution to consider approval of a liquor license for Playas Nayaritas, LLC was added to the agenda as Resolution K-1.

**PRESENTATIONS AND PROCLAMATIONS**

Lance Werner, KDL Director and Anjie Gleisner, Wyoming Branch Manager, gave a presentation to City Council.

Werner described KDL's service shift of service during 2020 that allowed the library to continue to serve the community.

Gleisner spoke about activities that happened at the Wyoming branch during 2020, including a materials review, a curbside lending program, take and make crafts and the conversion of many programs to virtual formats. Werner and Gleisner also discussed KDL's ability to continue to provide Wifi access, including placement of mobile hot spots for areas lacking that infrastructure.

Mayor Poll read a proclamation recognizing June as LGBTQ+ Pride Month.
