

**PROCEEDINGS OF THE REGULAR WYOMING CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
HELD AT CITY HALL, SEPTEMBER 19, 2022 AT 7:00 P.M.**

The meeting was called to order by Mayor Pro Tem Sam Bolt.
